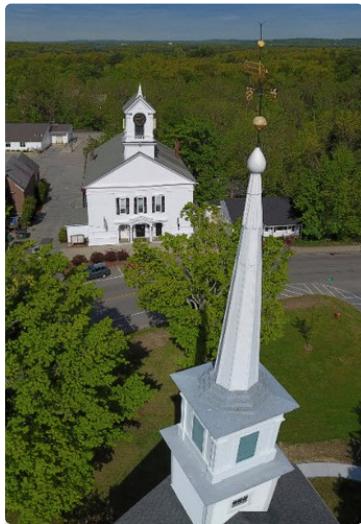

Nashoba Valley Regional Dispatch Update:

The Executive Director recently announced that he will be taking another position in California but he has not officially given the Administration Board, of which each Town Administrator/Manager sits on from

the member communities, his written notice of resignation. The Administration Board has had meetings to discuss a plan for the current Director's departure and once received will need to vote to appoint the Deputy Director as the Acting Director until the position is permanently filled.

Union Negotiations:

We have had our initial meetings with both the Fire and DPW unions and have a meeting with the DPW Union on March 3rd and a meeting with the Fire Union on March 4th. Our initial meeting with the Clerical Union is scheduled for March 17th.

FY 2022 Health Insurance Renewal Rate Update

The Public Employee Committee members concurred that they were also in favor of adding Vision as an optional insurance for employees. Had we not participated in the Post 65 Program our health insurance renewal rate would have been a 2.47% increase, participating in this program brought the active renewal rate down to a .47% increase, and by adding a Vision plan it brought the active renewal rate to a -.03% decrease. On top of all of this we received a Premium Holiday, which will equate to a \$128,076 one time savings on the town side and a \$241,257 one time savings on the school side.

Update on Debris found on Woodruff Property:

At the November Special Town Meeting a resident spoke about possible illegal dumping on the Woodruff Property off of Leominster Road. After town meeting the Fire Chief and a member of the Fire Department, who is also on the Conservation Commission, inspected the site and took a number of pictures which were forwarded to the Board. It appeared to them that it was all old farm equipment and materials left by the previous owner and not new material since the town purchased the property in 1999. Since then we have engaged a consultant to perform an Environmental Site Assessment of the property to determine if the materials in the ravine are hazardous and to provide a report on the likely ongoing environmental impact of the materials, recommendations on removal/site restoration work, and preliminary cost estimate for site clean-up. The consultant will be performing the assessment as soon as the snow is gone. I will update the Board once the work is complete.

Fuel Tank Update:

The fuel tanks at the DPW are up and running and Departments who use the facility for fueling their town/school vehicles have begun to do so.

for the project has been sent to the Board and has been filed with the Conservation Commission. The purpose of this SPCC Plan is to minimize the potential for a discharge of oil from any associated oil storage or handling activities at the DPW facility. The DPW Director will be carrying out the recommendations in the plan for inspections, training, etc. going forward, with training likely to be done in the couple of weeks.
