- (iv) by deleting from Chapter 12, entitled “Boards, Commissions and Committees,” from Article V, entitled “Public Access Cable Committee,” from Section 12-9, entitled “Establishment and purpose,” second sentence, the phrase “Lunenburg TV Channels 8 and 9” and substituting the phrase “Lunenburg TV Channels 8, 9 and 99” therefor;
- (v) by deleting from said Chapter 12, from said Article V, from Section 12-11, entitled “Membership,” within Subsection A, the phrase “or full-time students at Lunenburg High School”;

- (vi) by deleting from said Chapter 12, from said Article V, from Section 12-11, entitled “Membership,” within Subsection C, the phrase “or any Lunenburg High School student”;
- (vii) by deleting from said Chapter 12, from said Article V, from Section 12-11, entitled “Membership,” Subsection G in its entirety, and substituting the following therefor:

G. Vacancies. Vacancies shall be appointed by the Select Board to serve the balance of the unexpired term.
- (viii) by deleting from said Chapter 12, from Article VII, entitled “Americans with Disabilities Committee,” from Section 12-20.1, entitled “Meetings,” within Subsection E, the word “Robett’s” and substituting the word “Robert’s” therefor;
- (ix) by deleting from Chapter 81, entitled “Town Meetings,” from Article I, entitled “Town Meetings,” from Section 81-1, entitled “Warrants,” within Subsection A, Item G, the phrase “Centre Pizza & Variety” and substituting “JAXX Country Variety” therefor; and
- (x) by deleting from Chapter 168, entitled “Licensing,” from Article II, entitled “Denial or Revocation of Licenses for Failure to Pay Taxes,” Section 168-6, entitled “Exceptions,” in its entirety, substituting the following therefor:

“The inclusion of a property, or portion of a property, in the Sewer Service Area may establish eligibility to connect to the sanitary sewer but shall not create an entitlement thereto. All sewer connections shall be subject to, and shall comply with, the provisions of this by-law, including but not limited to available capacity, capacity limitations and Sewer Commission approval(s),

where required. Neither the boundaries of the Sewer Service Area nor the requirement that a property be located within said Sewer Service Area to be eligible to connect may be waived.”

and

(ii) by deleting from Section 3.0, entitled “Connection Eligibility,” the third paragraph, in its entirety, which presently reads:

“Sewer connections shall be located entirely on the property they are to serve. The connection must enter the property directly from the public way in which the sewer is located. No connections shall be allowed via an easement. A sewer line must remain within the parcel that it serves.”

and substituting the following therefor:

“Sewer connections shall be located entirely on the property they are to serve. The connection must enter the property directly from the public way in which the sewer is located. No connections shall be allowed via an easement. A sewer line must remain within the parcel that it serves.

Notwithstanding the above, sewer connections may be installed in easements across adjoining properties, at the discretion of the Commission, through the issuance of a waiver under Section 10.0 of this bylaw.”

and

(iii) by deleting from Section 4.0, entitled “Sewer Extensions,” the fourth paragraph, in its entirety, which presently reads:

“All development and construction shall be monitored in accordance with the ‘Monitoring and Inspection Procedures and Fee System of the Lunenburg Sewer Commission.’”

and

(iv) by deleting Section 9.0, entitled “Regulation Changes,” in its entirety, which presently reads:

“9.0 REGULATION CHANGES

The Sewer Commission will establish a draft of proposed changes during regular, properly posted open meetings. Once there is consensus on the proposed changes, a formal hearing will be scheduled and will take place over 2 regularly scheduled meetings. Both hearings will be televised. A notice of the hearing will be put in a local newspaper at least 5 business days prior to the hearing dates. At the discretion of the Sewer Commission, the hearing may be continued to the next consecutive open, regularly scheduled meeting. Once the hearing is closed, the final changes will be drafted and voted on. The proposed and approved changes will be posted on the Commission’s Town website.”

and substituting the following therefor:

“9.0 REGULATORY AUTHORITY

The Sewer Commission is expressly authorized to promulgate rules and regulations effectuating the purposes of this by-law; provided, however, that neither the Commission’s failure to promulgate a rule or regulation nor a legal declaration of the invalidity thereof shall act to suspend or invalidate the effect of the provisions hereof. Amendment(s) to the rules and regulations may be contemplated during regular, open meetings of the Commission. Prior to the adoption of any amendment, a public hearing shall be conducted with notice of said hearing published in a local newspaper at least five (5) business days in advance. At the discretion of the Commission, the hearing may be continued from time to time as necessary. Following adoption, the amendment(s) shall be posted on the Commission’s Town website.”

and

(v) by adding a new Section 10.0, entitled “Waivers,” as follows:

“10.0 WAIVERS

Except as otherwise stated herein, the Sewer Commission reserves the right to waive, in its sole discretion, any provision(s) of this by-law and/or the rules and regulations adopted hereunder due to emergency circumstances; as may cause undue hardship to any person or entity affected thereby; or as the Commission may deem to be in the best interests of the Town of Lunenburg and not otherwise inconsistent with the purpose and objectives hereof. Each request for a waiver shall be made in writing to the Commission and shall require an affirmative vote of approval by a majority in number of the Commission. In no event shall the Commission waive any requirement of the Massachusetts General Laws or any regulation adopted by the Commonwealth thereunder. There shall be no entitlement to a waiver; and the grant of a waiver in one instance shall not require the Commission to grant a waiver in any other.”

- (1) An applicant shall submit a copy of its Host Community Agreement (HCA) with the Town, authorizing its development of a Marijuana Establishment on the site subject to receipt of applicable permits; as well as copies of all registrations and licenses, if any, issued to the applicant by the Commonwealth or any of its agencies for operation of a Marijuana Establishment on the site. Licensure by the Commonwealth is not a prerequisite to application submittal; provided, however, that commencement of use of or construction under a special permit is and shall be conditioned upon issuance of all requisite provisional licenses and approvals under applicable law. Final licensure of the Marijuana Establishment shall be required before commencement of operations.

ARTICLE 30. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following “Resolution in Support of Changing the State Flag & Seal of Massachusetts”:

Whereas the history of Massachusetts is replete with instances of conflict between the European Colonists and the Native Nations of the region, who first extended the hand of friendship to the Colonists on their shores in 1620, and helped them to survive starvation during the settlers first winters on their land;

Whereas members of the Native Nation for who the State of Massachusetts is named were ambushed and killed by Myles Standish, first commander of the Plymouth Colony, in April of 1623, barely two years after the Pilgrims arrived on their shores;

Whereas the Colonial broadsword brandished above the head of the Native man on the Massachusetts State Flag and Seal is modeled after Myles Standish’s own broadsword, borrowed for that purpose from the Pilgrim Hall in Plymouth by the illustrator Edmund Garrett in 1884;

Whereas the belt binding the Native’s cloak on the Flag and Seal is modeled after a belt worn by Metacomet, known to the English as King Philip, who was among the Wampanoag leaders who resorted to a mutually destructive war in 1675-76 in defense of Native lands against Colonial encroachment;

Whereas the proportions of the body of the Native man in the Flag and Seal were modeled from a Native skeleton kept in Winthrop, the bow modeled after a bow taken from a Native man shot and killed by a colonist in Sudbury in 1665, and his facial features taken from a photograph of an Ojibwe chief from Great Falls, Montana, considered by the illustrator to be a “fine specimen of an Indian,” though not from Massachusetts;

Whereas the history of relations between Massachusetts since Colonial times and the Native Nations who continue to live within its borders includes the forced internment of thousands of so-called “praying Indians” on Deer Island, in Boston Harbor, where they died by the hundreds of exposure in 1675, their subsequent enslavement in Boston, Bermuda, and the Caribbean Islands, the offering of 40 pounds sterling as bounty for the scalps of Native men, women and children in Massachusetts beginning in 1686, increased to 100 pounds sterling for the scalps of Native adult males by 1722, half that amount for Native women and children;

Whereas Native Americans were legally prohibited from even stepping foot into Boston from 1675 until 2004, when that law was finally repealed;

Whereas the 400th anniversary of the landing of the colonists at Plymouth Plantation in the year 2020, afforded every citizen of the Commonwealth a chance to reflect upon this history and come to an awareness of the possibility of a better relationship between the descendants of the Colonial immigrants and the Native Nations of the Commonwealth;

Whereas Native Americans have long suffered the many abuses of racism, the appropriation of their symbols for public schools and sports teams, the loss of their ancestral lands and the encroachment of their cultural lifeways;

Whereas the area now known as the Town of Lunenburg shares a rich Native history with modern day tribal Nations, who inhabited this area long before the first colonial settlers arrived circa 1718, such as the Abenaki and the Nipmuc;

Now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Lunenburg hereby adopts this resolution in support of the work of the Special Commission Relative to the Seal and Motto of the Commonwealth, established by a Resolve of the General Court in 2020 and appointed by the Governor to recommend changes to the current flag and seal of Massachusetts; and in support of a new seal and motto for the Commonwealth that may better reflect our aspirations for harmonious and respectful relations between all people who now call Massachusetts home.
